Overall evaluation and questions to be <u>answered</u> in the course of the defense:

Author of bachelor thesis did a very good research about the relevance and development of FDI in the Czech Republic. It is true, that FDI were very important at the beginning of economic transformation in the Czech Republic, therefore it is a relevant economic issue, which can be analysed. Author investigated the impact of CNB interest rates and their changes on FDI inflows through regression analysis. Statistical model did not prove any strong relation among monetary policy instruments and the FDI inflows to the Czech Republic. In the second part of FDI analysis, author investigated and evaluated the most important factors that attract FDI into the Czech Republic. Author could have taken into account another relevant factors (e.g. income taxation, labour taxation, etc.) to extend the regression analysis model. Another option was to analyse inflow of FDI by using this model in other neighbouring countries (e.g.: Poland, Slovakia, Hungary - V4 countries), because the results could have been different. Bachelor thesis is very good and I recommend the thesis for defence. Question: How did you choose parameters used in regression analysis and why did not you take into consideration another parameters (mentioned above in this assessment)?
