Comments and Questions:

The author selected a unique and very current topic in which he had a lot of interest; it was, however, quite a broad approach, covering several subtopics. This, among other things, resulted in some sections being difficult to follow; the overall work and final result could be more focused and concise. More clarity in goal and objective definition as well as implementation throughout the work would have greatly improved the final result. The use of case studies is a positive; however, their inclusion could have been further developed and incorporated. Chapter three could also have been more closely coordinated. The thesis would have benefited from an additional round of harmonization of the various parts in order to achieve a more integrated and coordinated whole. In addition, a final proofreading would have eliminated some of the minor, but unnecessary, typos.
